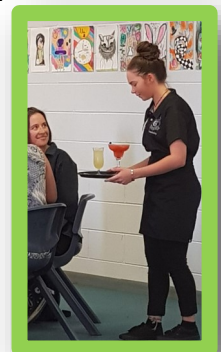
To Parents, Carers and Community Members,

School reports are currently being written by teachers and will be given out at Presentation Night. If you have any questions in relation to your child's report please contact the school to make time for an interview.

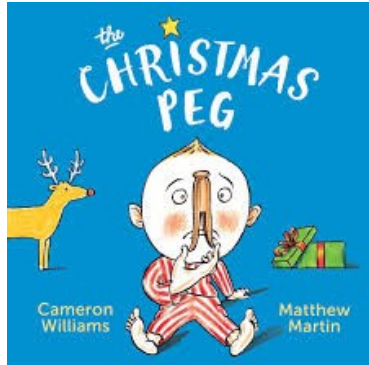
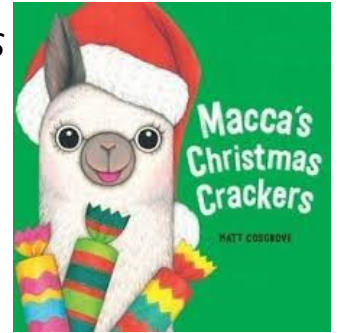
