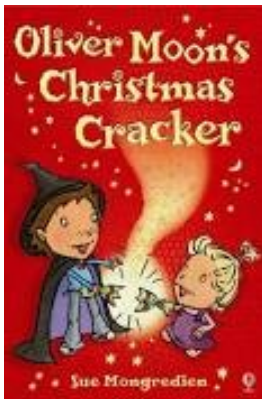


LIBRARY

Charlie's Stars is a heart felt story about family and remembering loved ones.



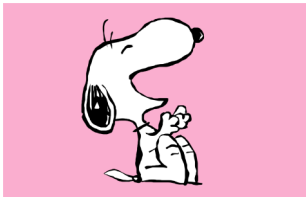
'Oliver Moon's Christmas Cracker' written by Sue Mongredien

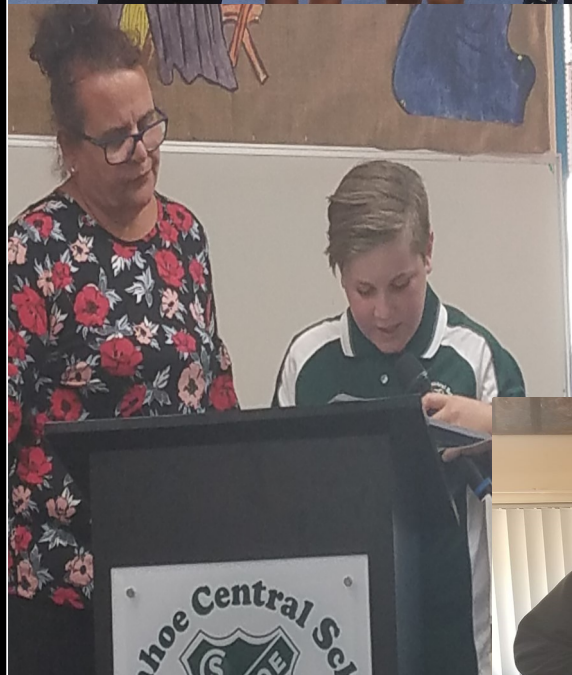


REMEMBRANCE DAY 2019

The Art work on display of brightly painted poppies was superb and the lawn was alight with poppies waving in the gentle breeze.

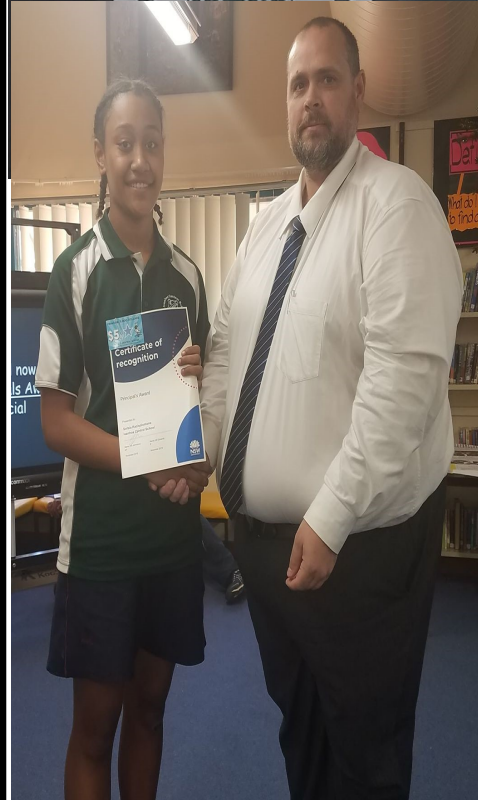
Good to see so many community members present.
