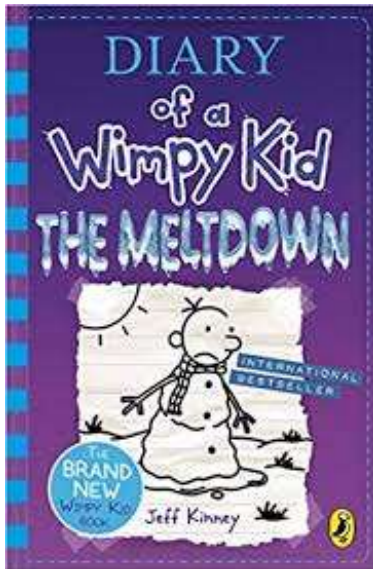
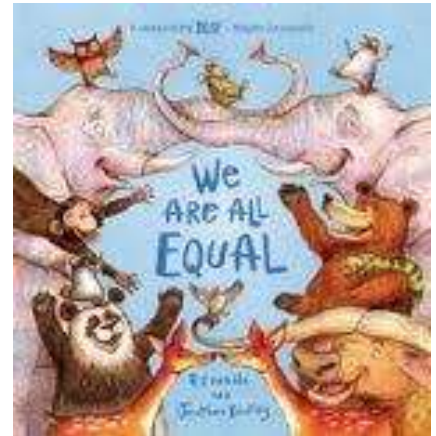

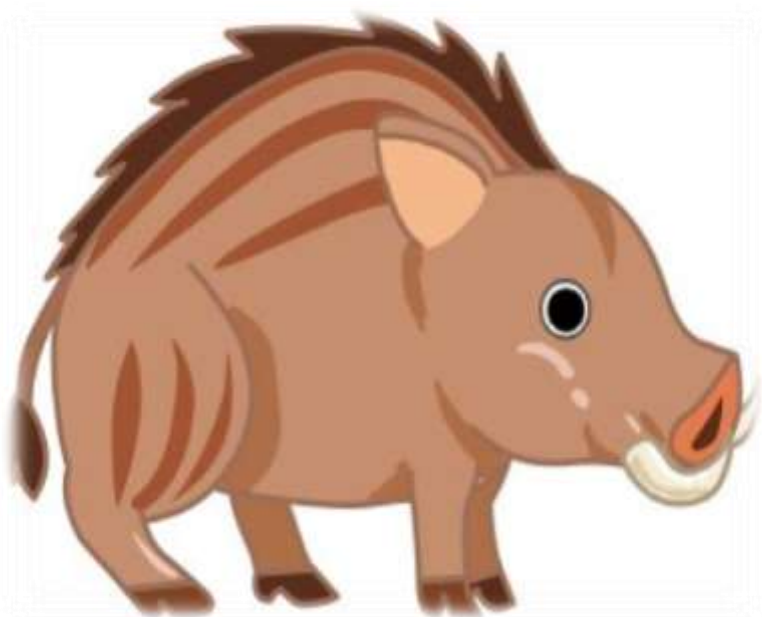

Community Sharps bins in Ivanhoe

Local Council, working with NSW Health, provides community sharps disposal services around the state. Community sharps bins are usually bright yellow and provide an important access point for people to dispose of items that may be of harm around the home and in the community.

What are community sharps?

Community sharps are items generated in the community that need to be disposed of in special bins instead of in the general rubbish, because they can break the skin and cause injury to waste disposal workers and the general community.

Common examples of community sharps include diabetic needles and lancets, agricultural sharps and other needle and syringe equipment that is used for injecting. Community sharps can all be put directly into a community sharps bin or into a smaller rigid container, which when full can be put into the larger bins.

Can I put other things into the Community Sharps bin?

Certainly! Needles aren't the only things which might cause injury to a waste disposal worker or community member. Fish hooks, razors, broken glass or any other bits and pieces that could be dangerous if stepped on handled accidentally can go in these bins to help make the area safe.

Just remember these are for an important reason, so don't fill them with general rubbish or there will be nowhere to put community sharps!
