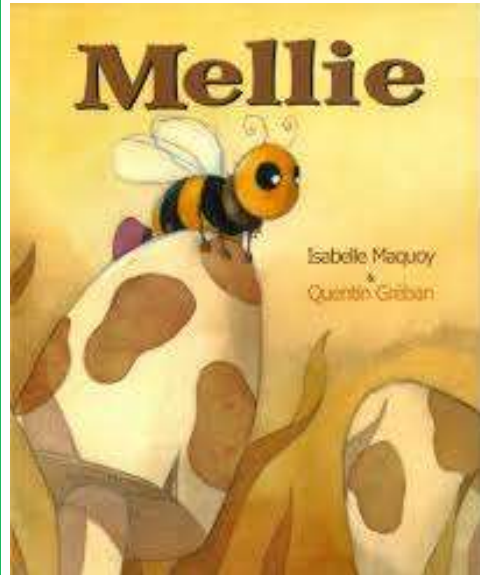

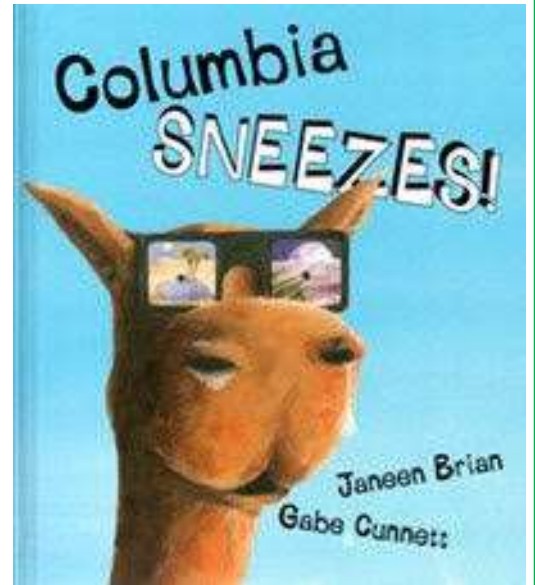
‘Columbia Sneezes!’ written by Janeen Brian and Gabe Gunnett.

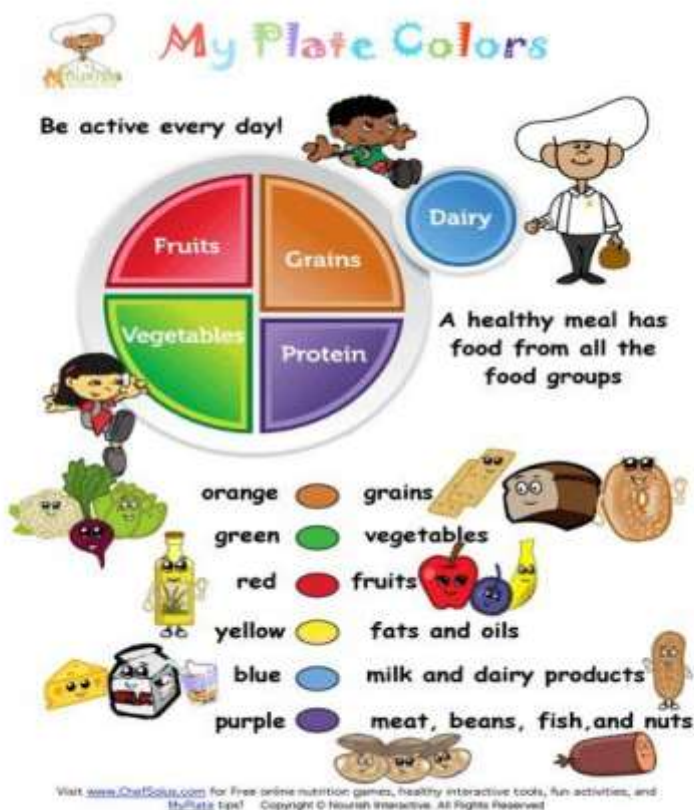
‘Mellie’ written by Isabelle Maquoy and

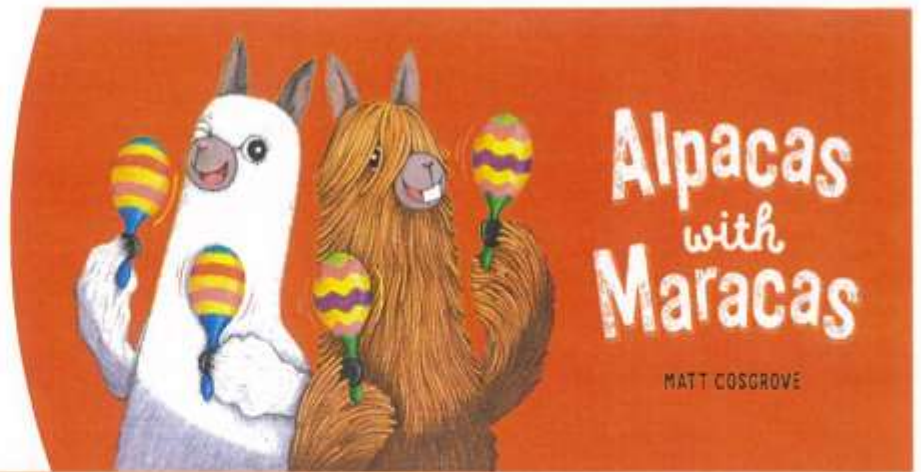

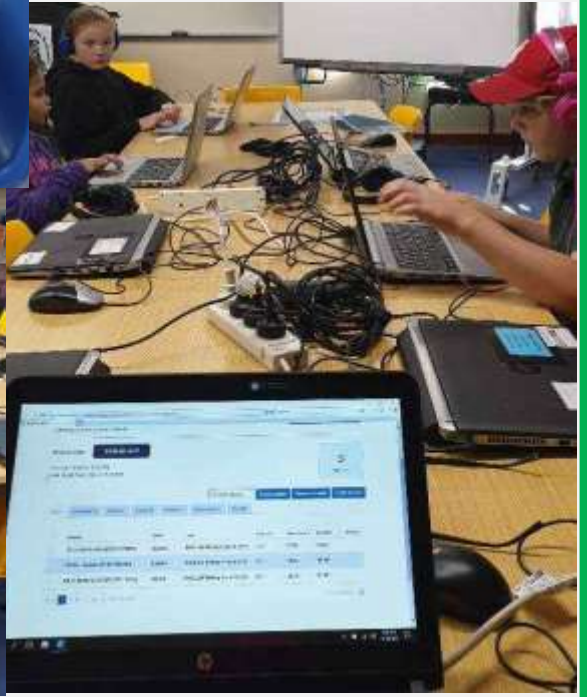

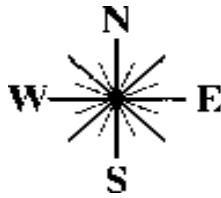
