TUESDAY AND THURSDAY—9.30 to 12.00

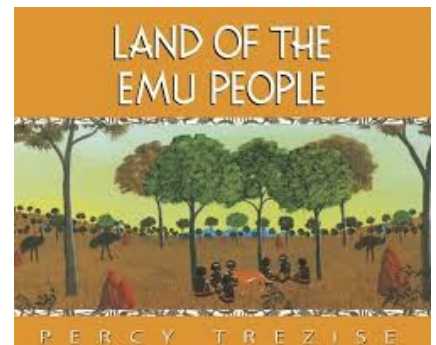
Children aged from birth to 5 years are most welcome to attend, accompanied by their parent/s. This is an opportunity for parents to interact and for children to socialise and play together.

The groups take place in the HUB room which is situated within the school grounds and in the building located separately at the front of the school on the southern end.

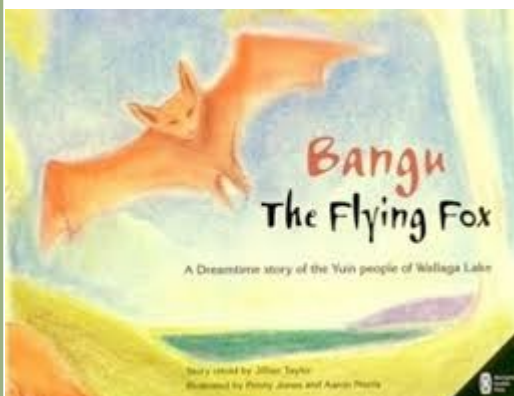
LIBRARY

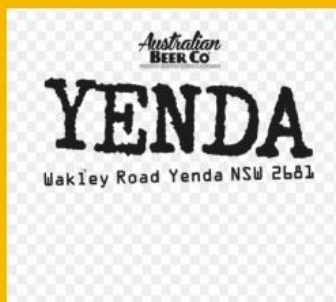

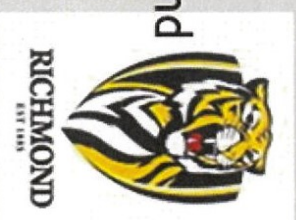

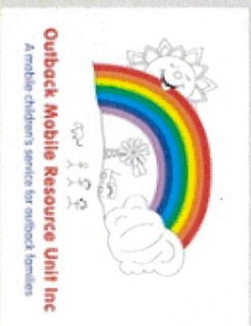
