The theme for the library display this term is
'Under the Sea'

STUDENTS: *Can you identify the olive sea snake in one of the posters in the display?*

Did you know that the olive sea snake is one of the most common sea snakes of Australia.

Like many other species of snakes, olive sea snakes can be different colours. Some may be grey, white, olive, yellow or brownish. The olive sea snake often swims near the surface of the water. It usually sleeps at night under the water. The working of the body parts slows down a great deal when the reptile is asleep, so that it uses very little oxygen and can remain underwater for some hours without going to the surface to breathe.

The snake can swallow prey larger than its head, but it needs a fair while to get all the goodness out of the food that it has swallowed.

This weeks we feature the following books:

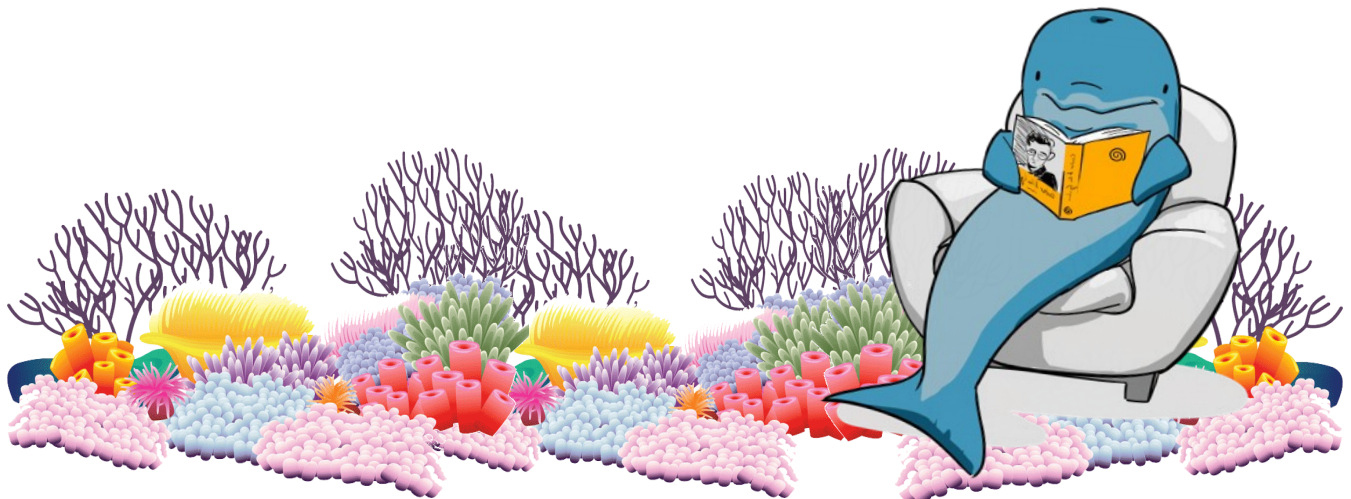
'The Deep' written by Tim Winton.
